Nathaniel Dominy, currently an Associate Professor in the Department of Anthropology at Dartmouth College, is visiting DBS next week and will be giving two seminars. Nate works at the intersection between primate behavior, ecology, and evolution. He is interested in how humans and nonhuman primates acquire, process, and assimilate food, and the relationship of such behaviors to the evolution of anatomical form and function, and combines field studies with lab-based molecular, nutritional, and isotopic analyses. Nate has published in every top journal from Nature downwards, and in 2009 was named in Popular Science's "Brilliant 10" list of research scientists under 40 who were shaking up their fields. He is an excellent speaker and his seminars are not to be missed.
