<p>About the Lecture:</p> <p>Regulating Long Term Care Quality: An International Comparison</p> <p>This lecture summarizes the results of a soon to be published edited book on regulating long term care quality in developed and developing countries around the world that was edited by the author. This book is the first to provide a comprehensive international survey of long-term care provision and regulation, built around a series of case studies from Europe, North America and Asia. The analytical framework allows the different approaches that countries have adopted to be compared side by side and readers are encouraged to consider which quality assurance approaches might best meet their own country's needs.</p>		
<p>About the Speaker:</p> <p>Dr. Vincent Mor is the Florence Pirce Grant Professor of Community Health in the Public Health Program of the Brown University School of Medicine. Dr. Mor has been on the faculty of the Department of Community Health since 1981 until it became the Department of Health Services, Policy and Practice. Dr. Mor was one of the founders of the Department's graduate program in 1986 and directed the Center for Gerontology and Health Care Research for 10 years. He served as Chair of the Department of Community Health from 1996 until 2010.</p> <p>Dr. Mor has been Principal Investigator of over 30 NIH funded grants focusing on the organizational and health care delivery system factors associated with variation in use of health services and the outcomes frail and chronically ill persons experience. He was the recipient of an NIA MERIT award, received the Distinguished Investigator Award from AcademyHealth and the John Eisenberg award for Excellence in Mentoring. He currently directs a large Program Project grant from the NIA to study the transformation of the US long term care system.</p>
